WHAT IS YAC?

Through the passage of a City Council resolution, the City of Sealy created the Sealy Youth Advisory Commission known as YAC. The organization comprised of youth grades 7 through 12, act as a liaison between the youth of our community and City Council. Through service, projects, recreational and social events, YAC promotes civic responsibility and safety among Sealy youth.

Since the creation of YAC in August 2005, we have hosted two junior high Fantasy of Lights dances, participated in two mock trials in recognition of municipal courts week, and participated in a volleyball tournament. We also hosted a junior high dance in Spring 2006, and seven very successful "Movies in the Park". Another "Movie in the Park" will be held in the April 2010.

YAC, also, participated in the Community Wide Clean-up in 2006 and 2007 and won the 2006 contest by picking up 50 bags of trash and 42 tires in Sealy. The long term goals of YAC are to build a skate park. YAC also voted to help raise funds for a youth recreational center in Sealy, through the Boys & Girls Club, which has now been turned over to YMCA. We're also looking into building a dog park for Sealy residents.

If anyone is interested in joining YAC, just download an application on the city's website www.ci.sealy.tx.us and turn it in at City Hall. Applications are also available at the School Offices. There are no membership fees. Members are asked to volunteer to work YAC-hosted events. Meetings will be held the 1st Monday of the month at 5:15 p.m. at City Hall. Many meetings have educational topics. One summer the Fire Marshal came out and demonstrated uses of Fire Extinguishers and members were able to put out a real fire. The past three December meetings, members made and distributed Christmas cards for the residents at the local nursing home. At two previous meetings, Wesley Cooksey brought his living reptile and spider exhibit. Officer Eric Gum also brought the new K-9 Officer "Scout" to a meeting this year and answered questions from YAC members. YAC hosted a Dunking Booth at the July 2009 Sealybration and YAC members had a great time working the booth.
