

## JUROR'S RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

**Right to Reemployment:** A private employer may not terminate the employment of a permanent employee because the employee serves as a juror. An employee whose employment is terminated in violation of this section is entitled to return to the same employment that the employee held when summoned for jury service if the employee, as soon as practical after release from jury service, gives the employer actual notice that the employee intends to return. (Civil Practice and Remedies Code, Section 122.001). Terminating an employee who performs jury duty is punishable by up to 180 days in jail and/or a fine not to exceed \$2000 (Civil Practice and Remedies Code, Section 122.002).

### TAKE SERIOUS NOTE:

**Failure to Answer Summons and Penalties:** Any person summoned who fails to attend or who fails to remain in attendance until discharged by the Court may be fined an amount not to exceed \$100 for contempt (Code of Criminal Procedure, Article 45.027). Additionally, a person shall be fined not less than \$10 nor more than \$100 if the person: (1) fails to attend court in obedience to the notice without reasonable excuse; or (2) files a false claim of exemption from jury service (Government Code, Section 62.111).

**Proper Clothing Required:** All persons entering the courtroom should be dressed in clothing reasonably befitting the dignity and solemnity of the court proceedings.

**Exempt or Disqualified:** You *do not need to appear in person* if you are exempt or not qualified for jury service. **To claim an exemption or report your disqualification you must complete the following form below, sign it and mail or personally bring it immediately to the address printed on the front of this summons.**

<p>To serve as a juror you <i>must</i> meet qualifications:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. be at least 18 years of age;</li> <li>2. be a citizen of this state and a resident of the county in which you are to serve as a juror;</li> <li>3. be qualified under the Constitution and laws to vote in the county in which you are to serve as a juror (<i>Note: You DO NOT have to be registered to vote to be qualified to vote</i>);</li> <li>4. be of sound mind and good moral character;</li> <li>5. be able to read and write;</li> <li>6. not have served as a juror for six days during the preceding three months in the county court or during the preceding six months in the district court;</li> <li>7. not have been convicted of theft or any felony;</li> <li>8. not be under indictment or other legal accusation of a misdemeanor theft, felony theft or any other felony charge; and</li> <li style="background-color: yellow;"><b>9. be a resident of the City of Sealy, within the territorial city limits. (Govt. Code, Sec. 62.501)</b></li> </ol> <p><b>NOTE:</b> <i>If you claim to be disqualified because you are not a resident of this county, you may become ineligible to vote in this county. If you state that you are not a U.S. citizen, you will no longer be eligible to vote if you fail to provide proof of U.S. citizenship to your county voter registrar.</i></p>	<p>You <i>may</i> be excused from jury service if:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. you are over 70 years of age;</li> <li>2. you have legal custody of a child or children younger than 12 years of age and service on the jury would require leaving the child or children without adequate supervision;</li> <li>3. you are a student at a public or private high school;</li> <li>4. you are enrolled and attend college;</li> <li>5. you are an officer or an employee of the senate, the house of representatives, or any department, commission, board, office, or other agency in the legislative branch of state government;</li> <li>6. you are the primary caretaker of a person who is an invalid unable to care for himself or herself. (This exemption does not apply to health care workers.);</li> <li>7. you are a member of the U.S. military forces serving on active duty and deployed to a location away from your home station and out of your county of residence.</li> </ol> <p>* You are not required to claim an exemption. It is your choice.</p> <p style="background-color: cyan; padding: 5px;"><b>NOTE:</b> <i>You may check our website prior to or the morning of jury service to verify if your trial has been cancelled.
